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Yuri Gagarin never went to space. And he faked his death.

Private opinion with conclusions derived from own research

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That's the man, the myth and the legend. And I mean that sarcastically of course. Contrary to what you have heard that Yuri Gagarin was the first man in space on Vostok 1, he never went to space. He never even got near that rocket in the first place. Even worse, he faked his death. I know it is shocking to read, but if you have been following my articles for a while it may not be surprising. Let me break it down for you.

First of all, have a good look at that space suit of his. It looks like a cheap Walmart garage overall. Tubes going in via a loose holes, a flunky zipper and a press button? Really? You have to be kidding me. You would say that that is just an outer cover from his real space suit, but that is just nonsense. Why not design the suit as it is without the outer shell? Why would that red overall even be functional? For sponsors? You know by just looking at what history has left us in pictures, that you are being fleeced. Again. By yet another hoax.

We will get into many more pictures, but I just wanted to start this paper hitting the ground running. Of course we can direct our attention to <u>Gagarin's wiki page</u> to start shooting holes in the whole narrative and unravel everything from there. We will also look at his alleged Vostok 1 spaceflight and his alleged death that 'took place' just seven years after his 'Vostok 1 flight'.

Let's jump in as this article is a wild one. We will look at the **man**, the **mission** and his **death** to get the picture of how the world has been tricked by this hoax.

Yuri Gagarin was born in a poor family, of course, and his parents were poor peasants working on a state owned farm. His home town was allegedly Klushino in the Smolensk Oblast. The stories on wikipedia about his youth feel dubious with various accounts of German Nazi occupation of his village, the constant misery of dealing with the Nazi soldiers and the classic victimhood narrative. It reads like a Hollywood script, 'rags to riches' success story that we have seen far too often. My hunch is that it is a cover story to hide Gagarin's real ancestry.

His parents are named on wikipedia, but we don't learn much about them. The last name is interesting. Gagarin. Although wikipedia paints the Gagarin family as poor peasants, the name Gagarin is not a peasant name. It is in fact a name of **nobility**. I haven't been able to link the famous Gagarin family with nobility directly, but there are some strange things with that name. It is quite old. According to this **source** we learn:

The Princely House of Starodub originates from the founder of Russia, Rurik, 867. The descendant of Saint Prince Vladimir, the Christianizer of Russia, and the son of Grand Duke Vsevolod III Bolchoie Gnesdo of Wladimir, 1175-1212, Ivan Vsevoloditch, Reigning Prince of Starodub, the author of the Princely House of Gagarin. The great-great-grandson of this Prince Ivan, Prince Ivan Fedorovich, called Lapa-Golibesovskoy, had a son, Prince Mikhail, and Prince Mikhail had three sons: Princes Vasilii, Ivan, and Youri "Gagara" whose descendants, the Gagarin Princes, served the Russian Throne in many distinguished positions.

This does not mean Yuri Gagarin is from nobility, but there is some smoke with this whole story and it gets more interesting. Apparently Yuri Gagarin felt the need to address rumors about his ancestry directly **denying** that he was from nobility. And he did it in his first speech after his famous flight. Wow. Why not first celebrate your 'achievement' Yuri, before dealing with your dirty laundry? So the Soviets took this quite seriously which is a sign that this story hit a sensitive nerve with them. We must be on the right track, because there is something there. Sergei Bouterline, an MIT instructor, claimed that Yuri Gagarin was his nephew and that Gagarin was in fact a descendant of nobles. So, this claim seems plausible considering the history of the name Gagarin.

If we look closely at the text above we see the name Youri 'Gagara'. I already showed you in my <u>Yuri Bezmenov article</u> that 'Yuri' is a Jewish name. So Yuri Gagarin, and the noble Youri Gagara have Jewish names. The Jewish Standard, a US publication of New Jersey since 1931, <u>claims</u> that Yuri Gagarin was Jewish and that he chose to hide it.

Other <u>sources</u> deny this of course, but provide weak explanations. Another cosmonaut, Boris Volynov, is an admitted Jew, who was in the same space program as Yuri Gagarin and was quite close to him. The article throws in the anti-semitism ploy to explain that Boris almost could not be part of the program, but eventually got his chance and went on a different mission than Vostok 1. My take is that they both were Jewish, the one openly and the other in secret. The one in secret, Yuri Gagarin, was placed in the more high-profile project of Vostok 1 and the other one in a subsequent low-profile mission.

Let's have a look at Yuri education. That has some serious problems in it. Yuri allegedly went to a school that was 'run' by a young woman who volunteered to be a teacher. Really? Was there no real teacher around? This was in 1946, the war was over so why not go to a proper school? But it gets better. Yuri allegedly learned to read using a discarded Soviet military manual. Right. In all the time they had after the war, they couldn't source some normal Russian language books? Ah of course, they were all burned by the evil Nazi's. Mind you, Gagarin thus first learned to read at age twelve. And he somehow managed to pull himself up to become the Soviet Union's best choice for the first man to go to space? It reeks again as a fabricated story, to cover the fact that Yuri was groomed somewhere else. Somewhere they do not want you to know about.

To fabricate his connection to aviation, they throw in the next ploy: a former soviet 'airman' joined the school and taught math and science, Yuri's favorite subjects. How convenient, no?

When Gagarin was 21, he was accepted at an Air Force pilot school in Orenburg, about 900 miles south of Moscow. Just five years later he was chosen as the Vostok 1 pilot to go to space as the first man in history. But there is a problem with this. Gagarin was not an exceptional pilot and even risked to be kicked out of the school. So that is the level that is required to become the first man in space? Yeah, right. They are telling you: It's all bullshit. His flight career is all hogwash and not believable. He went from nobody to 'first man in space' in just five years. Does this make sense to you?

Of course, he had a commander who was willing to give him another chance while he was almost kicked out. Why give him another chance? Don't you want the best of the best to become pilots? Especially during the 'hot times' of the 'cold war'?

Apparently not for young Yuri, who got a preferential treatment. Yuri even got a cushion to sit on to have a better view in the cockpit, because that's what you do in an air force cadet school. I bet Yuri's peers really loved that. With only 166 hours of flight time, Gagarin became a lieutenant and miraculously also **graduated** from flight school. What? Think about that. From **zero** to **166** flight hours to graduate. You **have to** be kidding me! Does that make sense to you? Do you think you can become a fighter pilot in just 166 hours of flight time? Come on! Here is a picture of Yuri (far left) as a cadet. Do you notice anything?



That's right. It is **FAKE**. The head is not on straight and is too small, which is also a problem with the other guys. The uniform is drawn in like a drawing or painting, the lighting does not make any sense and his left arm is disproportional. It is clear that all four heads have been pasted in. The picture obviously has been tampered with, which begs the question: Was Yuri even there?

Then we have two pictures that are **both** drawings of Gagarin with painted airplanes:





The plane numbers don't match either. In the lower painting you can see another plane on the right which is missing in the top one and there are many more things that do not match, but I think you get the point. The basic conclusion is that Yuri was **never** there.

When Gagarin was endorsed by **lieutenant colonel** Babuskin for the Soviet space program, he had accumulated a whopping 265 flight hours. Three weeks later he already entered the selection process for the space program. So Gagarin, who was an average pilot at best, with only 265 flight hours, managed to go from zero to Vostok 1. What a guy! What do we know of colonels in the Air Force? You got it, 'spookery'. So it is obvious we are dealing with a intelligence project and a hoax here.

On March 3rd, 1961, just **one year** into the cosmonaut program, he passed his cosmonaut exam. Just five weeks later he was the 'first man in space'. Right. Believe all of this if you live in Lala-land.

If the Soviet space program was real, I am sure they could have found the best pilot of that time, but they didn't. Why? Because Gagarin was **from the Jewish controlling families**, highly connected and carefully selected to run a **psy-op** on the world. They definitely had better pilots, but those were just normal unconnected soldiers. Yuri was special. He was a special agent, selected to do one job. To run the hoax and then shmooze the whole world with his lovely smile. He had to sell the **project** as **real**. It is as simple as that.

Gagarin knew what he was doing and that is why his whole history is just a bad cover. His life path to Vostok 1 makes zero sense and has a **probability of zero** that it would have worked out that way. Normal pilots clock thousands of flight hours until they can be selected for top programs. Not Gagarin though. He just skated himself in the top seat of the most important Soviet space program of that time. Gagarin's preparation was also overseen by a committee that was filled with Colonels and Generals, most definitely top Soviet spooks that were planning the Vostok 1 hoax.

At the time of his 'death', which I will cover later on, he only had <u>accumulated</u> 340 flight hours of which 75 was as a jet pilot. If even this number is real anyway. Also, before he joined the space program, he had done no more that five parachute jumps. For all I know, he never flew one second in any airplane and Gagarin's military stories are all fabricated. Even his biographer <u>admitted</u> that Gagarin did not excel at anything.

We are basically left with hearsay and a story full of holes.

I know there are reports that the Soviets sacrificed many pilots in failed rocket launches, before the glory of Gagarin and that Gagarin was just propped. But my guess is that those stories are fabrications as well as **none** of the 'manned' Soviet flights were **real**. I am sure many pilots died during many Soviet missions, but that was because of very crappy technology that was prone to many failures. Experimental airplanes, ejection systems, testing devices and what not. In other words, pilots died because of the failure of aircraft and technology which were prepared to **hoax** space flight, but **not** to **actually** go to space. What my research has pointed out is that **none** of the **space** missions of any space agencies across the world are real. They are **all hoaxes**. Every single one of them.

Vostok 1

Mainstream narrative has you believe that Gagarin sat in a capsule, was shot in space, circled earth and then after 108 minutes came back. I am going to show you that Gagarin was never in that capsule and that the Vostok 1 rocket never left Earth in the first place. It was **all** a **hoax**.

The big red flag to know all this is that Gagarin allegedly 'ejected' at 7 kilometer altitude out of the capsule, to parachute back to Earth. He even landed with his parachute exactly in the <u>same area</u> where he had allegedly practiced parachute jumping before, near his Saratov flying club. A coincidence? I think not.

There are some serious problems with the whole Vostok 1 space flight that I will cover here. I will focus on incongruencies in the story, whereas I will leave the rest of the **wikipedia** propaganda for the dear reader to laugh at. Let me first break it down for you what the simplest explanation is how this mission was run with the least risk.

Before they shot the Vostok 1 rocket into the air, they removed Gagarin from the capsule, directed him through a back door at the launch site, blasted the thing in the air, faked its trajectory, had Gagarin hop in an airplane and had him jump out of the airplane one hour and half later to simulate the 'space flight'. There is precedent for all these phases in the evidence that I am going to present to you.

Problem number one is that according to wikipedia there were **no tracking ships** for the Vostok 1 mission. These ships help with tracking of the rocket and for launching procedures. This is a huge red flag, because for the most important mission for the glory of the Soviet Union in the 'cold war' times, you have to make sure that nothing goes wrong while in the air/space. Doesn't it seem plausible that to increase the chances for a successful mission that you want to be absolutely sure there are no errors happening during the mission? Wikipedia states that there were only command points that were communicating with the rocket and that these were **only** in the territory of the Soviet Union. What? What about the rest of the trajectory, like over the Pacific, the Americas, Africa and Europe? How are you supposed to track that damn rocket on the other side of the Earth? We get no explanation.

But, I have an answer for you: They did **not need** tracking ships or any tracking posts outside of the Soviet Union, because the Vostok 1 rocket would only be launched within Soviet territory and **crash** after a few minutes **within** Soviet territory. Vostok 1 was never meant to go to space, rather it was used for the **perception** that it did fly into space. It's mission was to **crash** after launch within Soviet territory. The round capsule that they 'retrieved' where Gagarin allegedly launched in was a **duplicate** that they either dumped in some field or they just dropped from an airplane. No person ever sat in there. It is very easy to do all of this if you coordinate it correctly. In this way, Gagarin could just jump out of an airplane with a parachute and it would **not** matter much where his capsule would be, because he allegedly 'ejected' from it. Both the capsule and Gagarin landed with parachute and not very far from each other, so basically Gagarin could have jumped from the same airplane from which the capsule was chucked off. After 108 minutes in 'space', they just dumped the replica of the capsule somewhere where the models predicted it should be. Send some reporters to film the replica capsule, show the faked orbit of Vostok 1 and cover everything up under a massive propaganda and national parades, to solidify the images in millions of minds. Voila, the perfect hoax.

But let's unpack more of this massive con-job and see what we can find.

Problem two was that the mission was flown either by **automatic systems** or by **ground control**. Excuse me? So what was the whole purpose for Gagarin to be there? Wasn't he supposed to be the pilot? Why all the training? Nobody asks these simple questions. But I will tell you why Gagarin had no control in the capsule. **He wasn't even there**. He was allegedly hooked up to a heart meter and just before the launch it read 64. Of course it did. He knew he was not going to ride a giant bomb anyway. He was in a different room, pretending to talk to mission control from the capsule. Or they used a tape machine that was switched on inside the capsule. Gagarin <u>admitted</u> himself in his own book that a tape machine was used inside the capsule for the Vostok 1 mission.

Gagarin was not in the capsule, because before launch, they removed him. They did this with the **hatch story**. Two hours before launch, when Gagarin was allegedly sitting in the capsule, he reported that the hatch was not correctly closed, so people were called back to the hatch, they unscrewed it and screwed it back again. This operation took about 30 minutes to complete. And all of this was just moments before launch, but it was enough time for the bait and switch.

This hatch story was used to **remove** Gagarin from the capsule and relocate him. The hatch situation was just used as diversion to get Gagarin out before anybody would know what was going on.

The capsule **remained empty**, because the mission was always designed to be fully automatic or controlled from the ground. Because like that, you can fly the rocket to whichever point you want, **without** anybody ever noticing. You could **say** dat it was flying in space, but in reality it was flying towards the crash site somewhere in Kazakhstan where **all** rockets end up that are launched from Baikonur Cosmodrome. I bet the area where these rockets crash is a military base, highly secret and off limits to anyone. It is somewhere that is impossible to reach under normal conditions.


Problem number three with this hoax is that the capsule where Gagarin allegedly was in was connected to a second equipment module with 'cables'. That second equipment module was there to provide Gagarin a few days of survival equipment and food in case re-entry failed. Did you catch that? **Cables**. What is this, a clown show? You think those two capsules would stick together in the vacuum of space by just cables? Gagarin was allegedly lucky that the cables broke during the re-entry process due to, wait for it, **aerodynamic forces** and the **tumbling motion** of the spacecraft. Right. They really think most people are retards to believe this.

What in reality happened is that the upper module, the round capsule where Gagarin allegedly was in, was never connected to anything. It also had no hatch, obviously. It was flown high up in the air and dropped with parachutes in the 'landing area' to look like it came from space through the re-entry. Gagarin was thrown out of the same or another airplane and came down by parachute to land somewhere near the town of Engels where he was picked up. From that point on, the cameras and reporters would pick up the story again.

Problem number four is the fact that on April the 12th, 1961, the Soviet Union **announced** the existence of the space flight around 10am local launch time, about one hour **after launch**. This means that the highest risk of **exposure** of the **hoax** was the **lift-off**. This means that the Soviets were <u>not concerned</u> with the re-entry and safe landing of the cosmonaut. Why not? Because he either jumped out of an airplane, which is a very low risk maneuver or that the images of the retrieval of the Vostok 1 space capsule were taken a day or some time **before**. Probably the day before. That footage was already in the bag. The only thing they needed, were images of the rocket actually **lifting-off** and also **not exploding**. So when the rocket was blasted into the sky and they got the confirmation that all went well, the rocket was directed to the crash site and the images of lift-off were usable. That is why the Soviets called it in at 10 am local time, just a small hour after launch. They got all the images they needed to run the hoax.

The Americans learned this the hard way, because after the Challenger explosion on live TV in 1986, they had to go out of their way to explain the deaths of all those astronauts, while later on, most of them were identified to be still living. Like I said before, all space missions are hoaxes.

Problem number five is that the classic images of Gagarin being taken to the launch pad have a few continuity problems. Some **researchers** claim that the images were **not shot** on the day of the launch. The most remarkable of all is the footage of Gagarin inside the capsule. We see two sets of camera angles: one from behind him from somebody filming from outside of the capsule and also images filming him from below **inside** the capsule.



We see two sets of shadows behind his head (right), which is an indicator that there were two lights inside. But from the other angle (left) there are **no lights** to be seen at his feet. This means that two **separate** set-ups have been used to film Gagarin and thus two different points in time to film him. In other words, film footage has been taken in a studio for at least one angle of filming Gagarin, most likely the one filmed with the two shadows in the back.

In other words: the whole thing was staged.

One point to mention: those researchers claim that there was no room for lights or a camera to put at the feet of Gagarin and film him. That is bullshit. If you study the dimensions of the capsule, there is room. The point that has validity is that you do not see any lights or camera at his feet when Gagarin was filmed from behind.

Additionally, on the 12th of April 1961, the day of the Vostok 1 flight, NASA denied any knowledge of the flight, but the white house quickly corrected that later on. Now that is strange, no? America could have called bullshit on the whole Vostok hoax and provided information from their own agencies of what the Americans had picked up. But no, we get only crickets. Kennedy later on congratulated the Russians on their important 'feat'. Another proof that the so-called 'cold war' was a hoax itself too.

But NASA seemed to be right. They had no information on any Russian space flight on the 12th. Even <u>two days</u> after the mission, there were no pictures of Gagarin as a cosmonaut at the celebrations in Moscow. Gagarin even claimed they had **no cameras** within the capsule while he was on his mission. What? You are launching the most important mission of the 20th century and a pride to the Soviet Union and you have no means to capture any of it? Get out of here! The real reason is that there were major continuity problems with the whole story and that **none** of the material was **usable**.

This is because the material that was on hand would expose this mission as one of the **biggest frauds** in Soviet history.

Additionally, it is 100% **proven** that Gagarin was lying. There **are** images of Gagarin in his space capsule during his alleged space flight captured from **at least** two cameras. These images had been released to show him inside the capsule while on Vostok 1, so there are incongruencies in the main stream narrative. Even if these images are taken in a studio, it is clear Gagarin was lying. When somebody is lying, you know something fishy is going on. Here are two of the **images**:

The Daily Worker, a Communist newspaper in London, published an article on the flight before it was officially announced as having happened.

The article spoke on April 7 of the flight as having already occurred when it wasn't announced or tracked by American observing stations as in orbit until five days later.

The Communist newspaper revealed that the Astronaut, son of a Soviet plane designer, was under medical care. Later on, Russian scientists in Moscow denied that the earlier flight had occurred.

The Soviets are past masters at deception. It could be that they did have a man in flight and that the stunt failed.

Not to be denied their laurels, the Communists may have substituted the experience of one of their high-flying airmen who may have simulated the kind of altitude venture which the American, Joseph Albert Walker,

Did you spot it? Allegedly after eleven minutes Gagarin transmits over the radio to see South America. That is impossible as that is not enough time to get to South America from the launching position. 100% impossible. Gagarin allegedly also claimed to see farms below when he was at an altitude of 200 miles. That is 100% impossible. He also made a mistake by saying that he was over America, while the mission trajectory indicated he was over the Pacific. So there was either an <u>error in timing</u> due to the probability that they were using a **tape machine** inside the capsule instead of a real human, or that Gagarin was lying, but both options tell you one thing: They are running a hoax. Problem number seven is the existence of pictures of the Gagarin capsule landing in **snow** and also on **grass**. So which one is it?



As you can see, there are continuity problems also from early released pictures. And there is another problem with the continuity of some pictures:



Can you see it? These pictures are not made at the same time. On the right Gagarin has a bruise above his left eye, whereas that is absent on the left picture. That bruise above his left eye was the remnant of a skull brain trauma that he had suffered a few months later after the Vostok hoax, while allegedly jumping out from a balcony of a sanatorium in Crimea when he was passing his holidays there. It was allegedly an injury that resulted in permanent damage to his brain. It would become the topic of his alleged death. Also, the color of the 'space suit' is different and the pressure valve on the helmet is radically different.

Any questions? We are being fleeced here again.

'Death' of Yuri Gagarin

The alleged death of Gagarin is shrouded in the usual mystery. The **mainstream** story tells us that on March 27, 1968, just a short seven years after Vostok 1, Gagarin went down with his MIG-15UTI along with a flight instructor. His body and the one of the instructor were quickly cremated and interred into the walls of the Kremlin. Case closed. The problem is that the cause of the crash and even Gagarin's death was treated with the utmost secrecy, so obviously something is up.

According to a 2003 **released report**, the blame was put with the airport control personnel who supplied outdated weather info to Gagarin etc. But this was not the only version of the alleged death of Gagarin. A couple of more versions appeared in the years that followed the 2003 report and none of them can agree on anything. The main point of all these 'investigations' is: Gagarin died. Period. Most versions claim that Gagarin made a mistake due to unfortunate weather in which he lost control of the MIG jet.

Let's take a step back shall we? Why does a decorated Air Force pilot and cosmonaut, who was the 'first man in Space' need a flight instructor? Please dwell on that for a moment. This instructor was not a nobody. It was **colonel** and hero of the Soviet Union Vladimir Seryogin.

Mind you that Gagarin **graduated** on the MIG-15 aircraft. In other words, he was found capable of flying that damn plane. So what is the deal with the instructor? Some would say that he hadn't flown for years and wanted to 'get back into it'. But that doesn't fly either (pun intended). If you haven't driven a car for ten years, you will be able to drive it again. If you haven't flown an airplane for 7 years, you can still fly it, especially if you are a trained individual at that professional level.

There is at least a picture of Gagarin, just moments before his 'death'. He doesn't look good at all. You can see the deformation above his left eye and also the considerable amount of weight that he gained. Had his conscience caught up with him? Here it is:



There are reports that he was **groomed for politics**, but the balcony accident had permanently damaged his brain and he had become a wreck the years after Vostok 1.

But as I have already shown you, Gagarin was an average pilot and perhaps he had not flown anything in his life at all. Maybe everything is as simple as that he wanted to learn to fly for real and as a Soviet hero he was given that chance and he killed himself in the process. Maybe the whole crash would expose the **fraud** that Gagarin really was, so they covered it up. But maybe the explanation is much simpler than any of that, namely that he **faked his death**.

Also ask yourself this, and look at the picture above, why would they put that man, with his busted brain, inside a MIG-15? Really. To what end? There is no sane explanation for this. It wasn't something official or celebration related. No, it was just a **routine** flight. Why? There was absolutely **no reason** to take that risk with the busted Gagarin. **Zero**.

I know there is little hard evidence for a faked death, but couldn't the old trickster Gagarin pull one more trick on the masses? Couldn't he just have taken that picture, then gotten out and have let the flight instructor take the plane in the air and purposely crash it?

You would say, but how? It simple. Gagarin would be on the radio from a station somewhere on the base, mimicking as if he was in the air. The instructor would fly the plane to some uninhabited field 40 kilometers from the base and then just eject from his seat. Just know that it took **hours** until they located the crash site. So by that time instructor Seryogin could have nicely folded his parachute and walked to the nearest road to be picked up.

But get this: According to the **official report**, the remains of Seryogin were unrecognizable, but the body of Gagarin was **nowhere** to be found. What? Red flag alert, we are being fleeced once again here. But it gets better. They also claimed that during the search after the crash, they found Gagarin's 'cosmonaut' map folder, his wallet with his ID card, his driving license and a photo of Korolev. Does this remind you of other hoaxes? 9/11 ring a bell? When they found the pristine and intact passports of the 19 hijackers in the utter devastation of the towers' rubble?

And who the heck is Korolev? You will love this. Korolev was the guy who designed Vostok 1. In other words, he was a colleague of Gagarin. Do you think any normal person has a picture of a colleague of work in their wallet? For what reason? That would even be considered creepy. Normal people have pictures of their partner, family or kids in their wallet. Not Yuri though. He loved the designer of the Vostok 1 so much, that he had to have a picture of him in his wallet.

Yet again, this reads: "You are being hoaxed" all over it. Also they found some shreds of Yuri's flying jacket in the nearby trees. Yeah right.

Gagarin was not easy to find, but lo and behold, they 'came across body parts which proved beyond a doubt that Gagarin was no longer alive'. You see how they formulate it? They can't simply say that those parts belonged to Gagarin. They say that the parts **proved** Gagarin was no longer alive. What does that even mean? They don't actually **say it**. They **imply it**. Old trick from the hoaxers' book. For all I know they dumped some pig meat all over the place and gave Gagarin a new identity. There! Fixed it for you. Gagarin is no longer alive. Because he has a new identity.

There were no details on the body parts. There were also no details of the wreckage or parts thereof. Nothing. There was no information on the location where the body parts were found, their state or which ones exactly. Nothing. Even cosmonaut Alexei Leonov, who was at the crash site, did not reveal any details about the corpses of both Gagarin and Seryogin. Nothing.
