

Confronting cops with US Constitution - A risky bet

In this article I would like to give you an example of a **seemingly** successful victory over agents of the US constitutional legal system, but with a big caution to why this was a high risk move that can get you into a lot of trouble.

As always, I recommend that you read my article about the 'person' first and the two articles on strategies in court. Once you have done that, have a look at the video below and try to determine for yourself **first** why the guy was successful, but determine what are the underlying high risks of this approach.

What are the fundamental risks? What do you see that makes you conclude he has not fully comprehended the essence of the legal system? What stands out?

Pretty good wasn't it? Not so fast. There are some fundamental problems with his approach.

1. His emotional level was a bit much. It is always better to remain calm, because the way that the guy was handling this was a bit too forceful, which could trigger any cop to over-react. It is a fine line. If they were other or more experienced cops, the outcome may have been different and he may have been arrested, which follows to the biggest issue:
2. The guy acknowledges the legal system by adhering to the US constitution and his rights. This means that the guy is operating within the legal system. In other words, he **recognizes** the legal system, by drawing rights **from** the **legal system**. He quotes a law that may get the cops into trouble. The big risk here is that it **may** or **may not** get the cops into trouble if the cops arrest the guy. That is **not** predetermined by the guy nor the cops. Only the **judge** will make a decision on that. Since the guy quotes

a law, mentions the constitution and **also** mentions that he does **have** an ID (but not on him at the moment) he is **subject** to the **judge**. No matter what the guy or the police say, he will always be **subject** to the judge. Can you see that the guy uses projected fear on the cops to put pressure on them? That can backfire massively with more experienced cops. The guy actually threatens them with the chance that they could lose their qualified immunity by **illegally** arresting him. You see what is happening? Both the guy and the cops are operating within the legal system, bound by its laws and none of them have the power to definitively make a decision on the situation. Only the judge can do that. The guy just gave away any power that he may have had to control the situation to his benefit. He is subject to the judge, no matter what happens.

This means that the guy **recognizes** the constitution and thus the legal system. Then it is **game over**. Why? Because only the **judge** will have **jurisdiction** over all the subjects, over the guy and the cops. Whether or not the cops will get into trouble is **not** up to the guy. Judges have denied all kinds of laws and rights in the past, so it is **no guarantee** that any judge will respect the constitution or any laws. The judge has total jurisdiction and can do whatever he/she finds legal.

That is the biggest risk: He **cannot** control the **outcome**. That is because he already gave away the authority to the judge. I would say that he got lucky that the cops got intimidated and left. It could have gone completely the other way and he could have been forcefully arrested. Whether or not he committed a crime, i.e. a trespass of the legal system is a **subjective** matter in most cases: There are defined laws of what a crime is, which makes anybody eligible for arrest, but it is always up to the **interpretation** of the agent or cop to determine if it was a crime or not. The final say is always with the **judge**. That is why this move was very high risk.

What in fact happened is that the guy **gambled** on his ability to **intimidate** the cops with fear. Nothing more. That is because in the legal system you do not own anything and you act as if you are the legal fiction as described in my 'person' article. It is an uncontrolled gamble and a bet on a judge who would rule in the guy's favor. That is an extremely high risk bet, with very low favorable odds. The legal system is **always** geared against you and the house **always** wins. Think about that. If your destiny is not in your hands you **will lose**.

3. What the guy in fact is doing is saying that he recognizes the authority of the constitutional legal system over him, but denying the cops' authority over him. The essence of it all is that the guy, by recognizing he **has** an ID, he still **pretends** to be the legal fiction, otherwise he **cannot** draw rights

from the constitution. The **rights** are the bait for you to **recognize** the legal system. If you have to draw rights, it's game over, because only the legal fiction, i.e. the person, has rights, not you, i.e. the living individual.

Well, how to deal with it then? Very simple: **Deny** the legal system. Based on you being a living being, the legal system has no authority over you. Do not enter into a contract with the cops. In other words, do not act on behalf of the legal fiction. Also **deny** them the authority over you. Refuse to show them ID and calmly declare the following in your own words or do the following:

1. Deny the legal system
2. Deny having an ID
3. Deny entering into a contract with any agent
4. Do not sign anything
5. Declare to be a living being for whom the legal system does not apply

Even if you get arrested and they forcefully kidnap you, keep standfast and reiterate the above 5 points. Remember, the judge is the highest authority in court and the judge has **only** jurisdiction over the **legal fiction**. As long as you do **not** identify with it, they cannot do anything. Even if you spend a few days in jail, do not sign anything or declare anything.

The biggest mistake is for you to **act as if** you are your ID. So never do that and they cannot legally prosecute you. Also never ever recognize any legal system as then you already have identified with the person and you have entered into a contract with the legal system.

Once you take the bet and act as the person, the house always wins.
